Gypsy Smith (1860-1947) was one of the most loved evangelists of all time. When he would tell his life story, crowds packed churches and auditoriums around the world. Rodney Smith was born in a Gypsy tent in Epping Forest, six miles outside of London, England. He received no education and could not read or write. His family made a living selling baskets, tin ware, and clothes pins. At age 16 he trusted Christ, and began to teach himself to read, and soon began preaching. One Sunday afternoon, he even
