Treasured Friendships, Mutual Support, Common Challenges

When Bob Rodgers stepped into the role of Executive Director for Northwest Independent Church Extension, his desire was to focus on mentoring. It was out of this burden, that the Young Pastors Forum was begun (see the June 2021 Northwest Focus article on the NICE website). This year, in February, as a complement to the Young Pastor's Forum, Bob's wife, Katherine began the Ministry Wives Fellowship. Katherine explained, "My great desire was to provide a strength of friendship and support for the wives of the men in the Young Pastors Forum." She saw great importance in the young wives knowing that they are not alone in ministry. She went on, "I have formed valued and treasured friendships with NICE women since our very first days with the mission. Those friendships have served as a source of encouragement, counsel and prayer support over the years."



The Ministry Wives Fellowship meets twice a month via Zoom, and is made up of young NICE pastors' wives and some young Regional pastors' wives. Attendance varies depending on schedules, but as many as ten take part in the Fellowship. Katherine moderates the time together addressing topics such as parenting concerns, responsibilities in ministry, spiritual development and marriage.

Rebecca, one of the young wives said, "When I have been able to attend the Ministry Wives Fellowship, it has been refreshing and encouraging for me. We don't currently have any women's groups or Bible studies at our church, so it is nice to visit with a group of women in a similar state of life. Katherine brings a lot of understanding,

wisdom and encouragement from her time in ministry; I really value her perspective!"


Another pastor's wife, Rachael, commented that she was encouraged to be her husband's supporter. She said, "The Ministry Wives Fellowship is a great opportunity to connect with other wives starting out in ministry, and to encourage and pray for one another. One of the gals said she always sits where her husband can see her smiling to encourage him while preaching. She also reminded me to pray for my husband when he can hear me doing it."

Kassie, also taking part in the Ministry Wives Fellowship stated, "It has been such an encouragement to be able to talk to other women about the unique things that we're dealing with as pastors' wives; and to realize that I'm not alone in many of the challenges I face."
